

Our story began in January 2007, when we first came together in the picturesque Harz village of Sorge at the former inner-German border. Our aim is to keep the memories of the time of divided Germany alive and to communicate knowledge of this key aspect of our history to the generations that follow. Our museum consists of two parts: the Freiland-Grenzmuseum (inner-German border museum) situated directly at the former inner-German border and an exhibition located in the former railway station of the village. At the initiative of our association, in 2009 the railway station in Sorge was converted into a small museum. Here you can view historic exhibits from the daily life of the GDR border troops and the residents of the border region, as well as various documents from the era and many other items.
